The verges and hedges were generally wellmaintained. Footpaths were in fairly good condition but there were weeds in the gutter along parts of St Helen's Crescent.
2	Community Facilities Community centres, village halls, schools, parks, playing fields, churchyards/cemeteries, chapel surrounds, war memorials and public noticeboards	40	35	The churchyard has a lovely setting but there were a number of areas that required attention. The village hall (Harbour Lights Harmony Club) is a useful facility but there were weeds growing along the wall. The playground behind the hall has a limited range of fairly old equipment and would benefit from the grass being cut. The village noticeboard on Church Lane was good and up-to-date but the one on Waltham Road needs some renovation.
3	Gardens & Community Areas Gardens, window boxes, hanging baskets, tubs and planters, community planting, public areas, and allotments	50	44	There is an attractive grassed triangle at the junction of Waltham Road and Church Lane with bushes. Behind the triangle was a flagged area with a unique bench, with the village name forming part of the back, but unfortunately there was quite a lot of litter on the site. Residents are to be commended for some lovely gardens and colourful planting, notably: Willow Cottage, Litchfields, and Church View on Church Lane; Tudor Cot, The Hollies and Fallowfield on Waltham Road; 6 St Helen's Crescent; Walnut House, Old Chapel, Hunter's Gate, Moorings and especially The Thatch on Waithe Lane. The lack of community planting does limit the score in this section.
4	Other community features Shops, inns, farmsteads, workshops, business premises, advertisements and signposts	20	18	The village signpost on Waltham Road needed cleaning and the other sign at the southern end of the village was partially obscured by bushes.
